Creating a Butterfly Habitat

...at home, at school and in the community

Small Spaces – Pollinator Garden in a Container

An area with at least 6 hours of sunshine Large container at least 18" in diameter

Potting Soil

Choose 5 or more host plants from the following:

Aster (Stokes) Dill Parslev Black-eyed Susan Fennel Scubmint Coneflowers Milkweed Snapdragon Pansy Sunflowers Daisy

Choose 10 nectar plants from the following:

Butterfly Weed Lobelia Scorpion Tail

Blanket Flower Mexican Heather **Trailing Porter Weed**

Coreopsis (Tickseed) Mexican Sage **Tropical Sage** Cosmos Pentas Verbana Yarrow Lantana Petunia

Puddling Source – Flower pot saucer with sand, keep it moist Basking site – a flat light-colored rock in or near the container Avoid pesticides & purchase plants that were not sprayed with pesticides



Save the Monarch

Butterflies are facing an uphill battle to survive as more and more natural areas are replaced by urban development. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service with the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation have launched a major new campaign to save the declining monarch butterfly. They are asking Americans everywhere, from schools to community groups to corporations and governments, to help protect and restore butterfly habitat.

Life Cycle of a Butterfly

Egg - two days Caterpillar – two weeks Pupa- two weeks Adult – two weeks to two months



Begin with the largest plant. Scrape roots to loosen them from the root ball. Position the first plant against the edge of the pot. Continue with the remaining plants working from the largest to the smallest. Place a flat rock for basking next to the pot. Create a puddling station with a flowerpot and moist sand. Keep the sand moist. Water your butterfly container garden daily.

Butterflies you can expect to see

American Lady, American Cooper, Atala, Banded Hairstreak, Black Swallowtail, Cabbage White, Checkered White, Cloudless Sulphur Eastern Tiger Swallowtail, Giant Swallowtail, Gray Hairstreak, Great Southern White, Great Spangled Fritillary, Gulf Fritillary, Julia, Monarch, Orange-Barred Sulphur, Painted Lady, Pipevine Swallowtail, Queen, Question Mark, Red Admiral, Red-banded Hairstreak. Redspotted Purple, Silver-spotted Skipper, Silvery Checkerspot, Sleepy Orange, Spicebush Swallowtail, Variegated Fritillary, Zebra Longwing, Zebra Swallowtail
