CITY MANAGER PRESENTS PROPOSED BUDGET TO THE IRB CITY COMMISSION

On June 24, 2022, IRB City Manager Brently Gregg Mims submitted a proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 to the City Commission. The City invites everyone to become involved in the budget process. The proposed budget and updated Five Year Capital Plan is available for viewing on the City's website www.indian-rocks-beach.com. This proposed Budget is balanced in all funds and presents a comprehensive plan for the City's spending activities as well as an overall plan for providing city services during the coming fiscal year. The appropriation levels reflect the requirement to balance the budget while maintaining conservative budgeting principles. The proposed Budget promotes accountability and tells the continued story of our successes.

2022-2026 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN SUMMARY Roadway Milling, Resurfacing, Curbing & Drainage

Concrete curb, base rehabilitation, and/or new asphalt surfacing and associated drainage for each of the five years. This continued designation of funds represents the City's commitment to maintain and enhance this major City asset. In 2021, \$126,490 was authorized to update the City's comprehensive stormwater plan. The update will guide the development of future drainage enhancement projects and ensure compliance with the unfunded mandates as part of recently passed House Bill 53. During the budget process the City will review the findings of the drainage study and the City Commission will authorize which projects will be completed with the balance of the American Rescue Plan Funds. Total available funds for these projects are \$2,019,668.

Stormwater Reconstruction

Reconstruction of basin stormwater collection and discharge facilities as required by NPDES. Half of the cost of these projects will be covered by SWFWMD grants. The 2023 projects are located near 206 16th Avenue and the South end of 601 2nd Street.

Scheduled for 2023 & 2025 City Park Upgrades

In 2023 the Plan provides for:

- \$100,000 allocated for the multiyear rehab of the IRB Nature Preserve Boardwalk. Wood
 decking and railing will be replaced with recycled composite material. In addition, support
 repair will be completed.
- Electrical improvements including decorative lighting at Chic-A-Si Park & the 12th Avenue Park to accommodate gatherings and events.
- Fencing replacements

Gulf Boulevard Undergrounding Phase II

Design, binding cost estimates associated with projects continues. This project will be completed by 2025.

City of IRB Community Garden

Community Garden is a member-run garden located in the Indian Rocks Beach Nature Preserve, between 9th and 10th Avenues on Gulf Boulevard. It was created as an area for neighbors to plant, learn, socialize, and enjoy nature in a shared community space. Gardeners use Earthboxes to sustainably grow vegetables, fruits, flowers, herbs, and plants year-round.

The IRB Community Garden is maintained by the gardeners and City. The boxes are automatically irrigated by the City. No toxic sprays are allowed in the garden, and organic gardening is encouraged.

Earthboxes can be purchased from the internet and or at local home improvement stores. Earthboxes remain in the garden and are the responsibility of the gardeners to maintain, harvest, and replant throughout the year. All gardeners are responsible for purchasing their on-going Earthbox supplies and any gardening tools.

GreenTown Kids (GTK) - an Indian Rocks Beach based 501c3 environmental nonprofit - is the community garden coordinator. GTK holds several garden work days, events, and educational opportunities throughout the year for garden members, GTK members, and/or the community.

Seasoned and rookie gardeners, alike, are encouraged to try out Earthbox gardening in the community garden! IRB gardeners are welcoming to all and always excited to share their gardening tips, knowledge, and ideas with fellow gardeners.

FEMA – COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM

DID YOU KNOW that the City of Indian Rocks Beach participates in FEMA's Community Rating System Program (CRS)? The CRS rewards those communities that participate in flood mitigation-related activities that exceed the minimum federal National Flood Insurance (NFIP) standards.

A flood insurance premium rate reduction of 20% is available to all residents and business owners in the City. Voluntary participation in the Community Rating System (CRS) saves flood insurance policy holders in the City more than \$597,000 in premium discounts annually.

It is important to note that a reduction in flood insurance rates is only one of the rewards communities like ours receive from undertaking the activities credited under the Community Rating System. Others include:

- increased public safety
- reduction of damages to property and public infrastructure
- avoidance of economic disruption and losses
- reduction of human suffering
- · protection of the environment

If you don't already have flood insurance to protect your building and its contents (renters, take note!), please consider purchasing a policy today! Call your insurance agent or (888) 379-9531 to find an agent, and be sure your premium includes the 20% discount.
